So, we are pleased to share, that after working with DHS for weeks to ensure that landscape services are viewed as an essential service, we had a huge win with the inclusion of "landscapers" in the the revised "Guidance on the Essential Critical Infrastructure Workforce:

Ensuring Community and National Resilience in COVID-19 Response Version" in the Public Works and Infrastructure Support Services section of the document released this weekend. Refer to the government NAICS code for details about what is included in landscaping services.

It is important to note that State and Local authorities still have jurisdiction in their areas. We've updated our **Essentials Services letter** to share at the local level. This continues to be a rapidly evolving situation as states are continuously monitoring their specific circumstances and amending orders and directives that may impact the landscape industry. We will continue to work with all 50 States to ensure that landscaping services are considered essential in those States where it has been excluded.
